## **Cirque Éloize Cancels Mondavi Center Performances**

*May 25, 2010; Davis, California*—The **Robert and Margrit Mondavi Center for the Performing Arts, UC Davis**, has announced **the cancellation of the Cirque Éloize** performances scheduled for **April 9 & 10, 2011**. The company has cancelled its 2011 North American tour. Cirque Éloize is one of two events in Mondavi Center's 2010–2011 Marvels Series. The series also includes MOMIX, which will be presented on Saturday, January 29, 2011 at 8 p.m. and Sunday, January 30, 2011 at 3 p.m.

Patrons who have subscribed to the Marvels series or purchased Cirque Éloize as a Choose-Your-Own or Add-On event have the option to:

- a) Exchange their Cirque Éloize tickets for tickets to Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater scheduled for Tuesday, April 5, 2011 at 8 p.m. or Wednesday, April 6, 2011 at 8 p.m. Marvels renewing subscribers will retain their current seat locations.
